## How is IPRA related to the UN?

IPRA has a long-standing relationship with the United Nations, registered as a non-governmental organization (NGO) with the UN Department of Public Information. IPRA has also served for decades as an NGO with special consultative status with the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). Our fraternal relationship with the UN Economic, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has included deep connections with IPRA co-founder Elise Boudling, and the awarding to IPRA of the UNESCO Prize for Peace Education in 1989. With an ongoing New York-based IPRA UN Team working in a number of UN priority areas, IPRA was singled out by UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-Moon for our pioneering work especially around disarmament and an end to nuclear weapons.
